Christine Nixon is a former police officer who was the Chief Commissioner of Victoria Police from 2001 to 2009. She has been the chair of the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction Authority, Deputy Chancellor of Monash University, Chair of Good Shepherd Microfinance, Chair of The Royal Australian College of General Practitioners, and Chair of Monash College Pty Ltd.

Christine was the 19th Chief Commissioner of Victoria Police leading 14,000 staff, operating across more than 500 locations, and overseeing an annual budget of \$1.7 billion. She joined Victoria Police in April 2001, after serving with the New South Wales Police from 1972 where she became the first Female Assistant

She is a Fellow the Australian Institute of Police Management, The Australian Institute of Management, and a National Fellow of the Institute of Public Administration Australia. She has been awarded four Honorary Doctorates and a Master of Public Administration from The Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University, USA.

Currently Christine is a Vice Chancellors Professorial Fellow at Monash University, Chair of Leadership Victoria, was a Board member and then Chair of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners 2017-22. She was a Council member and Deputy Chancellor of Monash University from 2009- 2020, Chair of Monash College Pty Ltd 2011-2020 and Chair of Good Shepherd Microfinance 2011-2019.
